# From Iain MacDonald | Artistic Director

I hold *Cinderella* close to my heart as it was the first full-length ballet I choreographed on Joburg Ballet and I have had a wonderful time revisiting and adapting the ballet for this season. It is such a pleasure having Nigel Hannah and Christopher Montague as the Stepsisters, Bertus Dreyer as the King and Alison Sischy as the Stepmother with us as guest artists this season and I thank them for giving of their time and talents so generously.

The intention in presenting *Cinderella* as our final season of 2022 was the same as when I first created the ballet – to bring families back into the theatre, spending time together while being swept away by the magic of a classic fairy-tale. I wanted *Cinderella* to have both humour and glamour and for the dancers to be challenged by the technical demands of classical ballet.

Thank you for the creative contributions of everyone who has been responsible for bringing *Cinderella* back to the stage and to our biggest fans, the Friends of the Ballet, for sponsoring the printed programme. We at Joburg Ballet are forever indebted to our sponsors and we thank you for understanding the need and value of a ballet company.

The idea to present a new production of *Cinderella* to music by Johann Strauss II was taken initially in response to the fact that the famous score by Sergei Prokofiev comes with a price tag our ballet company could not easily afford. So to avoid paying the expensive performing rights for the Prokofiev music and still to be able to present this well-loved story, we turned to Waltz King Johann Strauss.

Johann Strauss II is, of course, famous for his immortal waltzes that are among the most familiar melodies of the European musical tradition. Strauss may not have been the first composer whose music shaped the 19th century's passion for waltzing but he is by far the most celebrated.

It has been a delight to work with music that has such a strong metronomic pulse and that highlights Strauss' flair for theatre and comedy. It has been wonderful to be inspired by so many sumptuous melodies and I hope you leave the theatre on the wings of Mr. Strauss' music.
